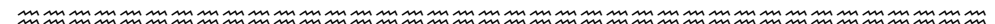
Any agenda items or notices of motion should be in writing and be addressed to the Secretary, PO BOX 35, Holden Hill, South Australia, 5088.

Off-road Maybe - But Not Off-track
 One of our principles is that we drive and camp with "Minimum Impact". With tourist season back in the outback, stress will again be put on the roads and tracks by an influx of travellers from cities keen to see the outback rivers in flood and water in Lake Eyre. Some travellers will have limited bush track experience - people who don't like any sort of corrugation. Last year many of these (and maybe some experienced 4WDers also) drove parallel with main tracks to avoid minor corrugations, causing considerable damage to the sensitive environment. These new tracks in turn became corrugated and bulldust holes created, so the track kept moving out. Major remedial work was flagged to 4 locations in Wiljira National Park (Simpson Desert Parks) and \$60K of grading to the William Cr. to Halligan Bay (Lake Eyre) Public Access Route No.13 still didn't prevent off track driving. All of this adds up to us preserving our ACCESS to these areas by sticking to the designated tracks.

Track Access Success - three new Public Access Routes
 The FWDSA NRAU recently joined negotiations with the Pastoral Board to add three new PARs on Eyre Peninsula. These tracks had been accessed by the public for some time.
PAR 22 (Googs Track) - 22km on the Kychering Pastoral Lease (Walgana) from Yellabinna Regional Reserve to the Transcontinental Railway.
PAR 23 (Nonning) - from the Iron Knob-Yardea Mail road (near Nonning Homestead) to Kimba.
PAR 24 (Secret Rocks) - A picnic ground on the Whyalla-Kimba road 44km east of Kimba featuring the large granite outcrops common on Eyre Peninsula.
What is a PAR? Public Access Routes are public routes that cross rangeland or pastoral property to an area of public interest (eg historical sites). Permission is not required per se, but note that PARs can be closed for a variety of reasons (eg stock movement or weather).

2010-02-24 FWDSA Advertising-Promotion Policy

Comment: The Feb 2010 Caravan & Camping Show has prompted a review of how we handle advertising and promotion in FWDSA.

Strict cross advertising and promotional rules apply to exhibitors at the show. FWDSA has applied an additional level of rules which ensure that we don't offend any organisations by promoting competitors whether they are at the show or not.

In short the only organisations we are promoting at the Feb 2010 show are VKS737 (which is a charity) and Kesab through our club involvement with Road Watch. Future promotions could include RFDS and Clean Up Australia - once again through our club involvement with these charity/civic organizations.

Preamble: A large aspect of FWDSA operations is to provide benefits for its members which,

1. are only available through our organisation, and/or
2. at no-cost or at least at a significantly reduced cost in comparison to what is available to the general public.

The most significant areas from club perspectives are the Insurances, creating and maintaining Track Access and provision of 4WD Trainer Training. To a lesser degree is 4WD promotion and Indigenous matters.

How we Advertise-Promote: The main vehicle is 4WD Matters - to a lesser degree are flyers (distributed when 4WD Matters cannot value-add to the subject).

Who we Advertise-Promote Policy: In a basic sense we advertise/promote,

1. FWDSA co-ordinated activities (eg AGM Weekend, ARB Open Day display, Caravan & Camping Show),
2. Charity based activities (eg those supporting RFDS), and
3. To thank those who have helped us out in a significant way (eg DEH, ARB and CCIASA recently).
4. Entry charge free events - such as some annual Indigenous information days

How much Advertising-Promotion do we give: The level to which the advertisement and promotion is done usually is proportional to the importance to FWDSA and/or the amount of assistance we have received - **an additional factor is the readiness of the organisation to communicate with us.** To put it simply "you scratch our back and we will scratch yours".



Who don't we Advertise-Promote: We don't promote the following,

1. Those whose activities are contrary to our principles/Code of Conduct - eg extreme 4WD competitions.
2. Those who won't communicate with us - various organisations (not many) appear to have determined that they see no value in continued dialogue with FWDSA - this attitude can also affect the level of promotion.
3. Commercial Organisations and Ventures - we don't promote either Indigenous or non-Indigenous 4WD pay-for-drive/hire sites, accessory and vehicle sales or repair companies, pay-for-entry/service, such as lecturers, charter or tour operators .

Often it is FWDSA people who have suggested the advertising/promotion rather than by the request of these organisations. These organisations generally have their own methods of advertising and often don't need, understand, or respect any support we may give.

We must be especially cautious of "getting into bed" with organisations which don't have our interests at heart, or who make glowing promises for future benefits that they can easily renege on.

The exception to this rule is where FWDSA is involved in an event with an organisation, or any of these organisations **has already been** particularly helpful or provided benefits or significant savings to FWDSA.

Advertising- Promotion (guilt) by association: Where we are using equipment purchased or supplied by various commercial organisations and they carry the normal logo of that brand then we have no qualms in using and displaying that equipment.

We would not however display additional signs at shows thanking the organisation for their assistance - this would generally happen through 4WD Matters.

The South Australia Department of Health is advising travellers to take precautions against mosquito bite due to their prevalence with increased water in inland Australia.

fight the bite!

Mosquitoes can attack day or night. Not only are they a nuisance but some can spread serious disease when they bite. Protect yourself, your family, your community.

Adults

- Cover up with long, light-coloured, loose clothing. Use an insect repellent containing DEET (diethyl toluamide) or picaridin on uncovered skin. Caution: always read and follow the instructions on the label.
- Put insect screens on doors and windows.
- Cover sleeping areas with mosquito nets.
- Avoid going outside when mosquitoes are most active (dusk and dawn).

Babies and toddlers

- Dress babies and toddlers in light-coloured, long-sleeved, loose tops and pants.
- Protect babies and toddlers with mosquito nets.
- Do not use insect repellents or sprays on or near babies and toddlers!

Outside

- Mosquitoes will breed anywhere there is water. Stop mosquitoes breeding:
 - Cover rainwater tank openings with insect mesh.
 - Cover septic tank vents with insect mesh and make sure lids fit well.
 - Empty or remove containers that hold water, like tyres, pots, cans, drums.
- Remove car bodies and other large rubbish items away from houses.
- Overturn boats, dinghies, canoes.
- Keep edges of dams and sewage ponds clear of vegetation.
- Get rid of leaves, weeds, grass and rubbish in roof gutters and open drains.
- Keep pools empty when not in use.
- Keep dams stocked with native fish to eat 'wigglers'.
- Avoid camping near creeks, water holes or in long grass - but if you do, protect yourself - **fight the bite!**

Recent Trip Reports (Pre-June 2010)

Peake - 28th - 30th May 2010

There were a large number of vehicles involved in the latest Peake trip. It was hard to pick the numbers with vehicles coming and going at various times however at one time on Saturday afternoon there was at 14 mobile vehicles and 1 not so mobile vehicle.

A few people had camped overnight on the Friday evening however most met at Taillem Bend around 9am on the Saturday morning 29th May. Trouble had already struck the group when Sara's "new" Holden Jackaroo showed signs of misbehaving having shredded a fan belt. While Ray assisted the RAA with debugging the mechanical issues, Lloyd acted as temporary trip leader and moved the group out towards Peake.

From Taillem Bend heading south east the group then turned off towards Lameroo and Pinnaroo just after the railway overpass bridge. Peake is a short 50km drive from that turnoff. The property the club was accessing was only a short distance from Peake. After setting up camp the group headed off into the sand hills, dunes and tracks of the approximately 10 sq km property.



I soon learnt how much I had forgotten about dune driving. I initially deflated my tyres to 26psi. I could not clear the first sand hill yet most others did. I had forgotten to disable the dynamic stability control function on the Discovery 3. I disabled that and still had problems. I dropped tyre pressures to 14psi and finally cleared the large sand dune near the campground.

However after a few more sand hills that were aggressively driven the pressure monitoring system in the Discovery 3 began complaining about low pressure in the front left tyre. I watched the indicated pressure fall quickly 10psi, 9 psi, 8 psi, 7 psi, 6 psi. I had a look and visually confirmed the flat tyre. I re-inflated the tyre however the pressure began to fall quickly so I headed back to camp while all the others lead by Lloyd drove the largest dune on the property. I had sand caught under the bead of the tyre so I had to replace the wheel with the spare.

Meanwhile back in Taillem Bend and with assistance from the RAA, Sara's vehicle was mobile again however it soon ran into problems again with the fan belt coming off. It appeared that the pulley that engaged with the fan belt was not properly secured. Eventually the vehicle reached the property however it was not to be mobile again for the rest of Saturday and Ray spent much time organising repair strategies. The vehicle was still immobile when I left on Sunday morning, I wonder how they got on?

The weather looked threatening for most of the day however the most we received was the occasional shower and in the evening the campfire roared into the night as most people had bought firewood with them. There was many a camp oven working well that evening with a gourmet variety of meals being produced.

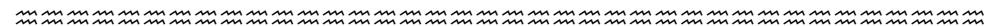
We all enjoyed a peaceful and relaxing evening with the usual banter around the campfire about various important issues such as manual versus automatic gearboxes and so on - well you know that story!

I headed back to Adelaide early on Sunday morning while the remainder of the group exercised their skills on the sand hills. Once again Werner was providing training and assessment where needed. I wonder how Baz went changing that wheel?

Thanks to Ray (and Lloyd) for leading the trip at various times. It was great to see such a tremendous turnout from the club.

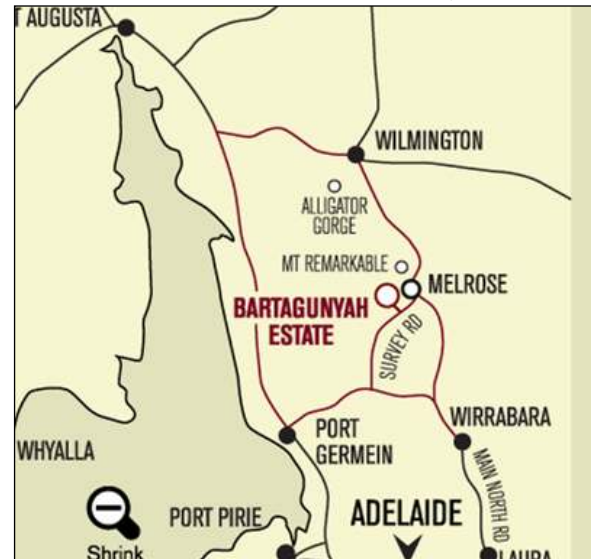
