Keep to the left on a multi lane road

Here's an interesting piece of Law which seems to be forgotten on some of our roads with multiple lanes.

When the speed limit on a road with two or more lanes (travelling in the same direction) is posted above 80 km/h then you are required to keep to the left lane. It seems relatively straight forward doesn't it?

If only Law was so simple.....

What if you wanted to turn right from a multi lane road?

What if there was something blocking the left lane?

What if I need to overtake a slower moving vehicle travelling in the left lane?

What if it's peak hour traffic and the right lane is clear?

What if there is a sign stating 'Keep Left Unless Overtaking'?

Australian Road Rule 130 relates to this Law and I have taken parts of this Rule and shortened them simplify and help answer the above questions.

Section 1 of this Law states:

This road rule applies to a driver travelling on a multi lane road if –

*the speed limit for that length of road is over 80 km/h; or
a keep left unless overtaking sign applies for that length of road.*

Section 2 of this Law states:

The driver must not drive in the right lane unless -

*The driver is turning right, or making a U-turn from the centre of the road, and is giving a right change of direction signal; or
the driver is overtaking; or
the driver is avoiding an obstruction; or
the traffic in each other lane is congested; or
the traffic in every lane is congested.*

So, in the most basic of terms – if the road you are travelling on is posted at 90 km/h or more and there is more than one lane then keep to the left lane unless there is a reason above not to.

All the details for membership renewal are contained on the current membership application & renewal form, a soft or hard copy of which can be obtained from the club membership officer (members@4wdadventurers.org).



ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

4WD Adventurers Club AGM Notification – 2nd August 2017

The annual general meeting (AGM) of the 4WD Adventurers Club of SA Inc. will be held on Wednesday 2nd August 2017 at the Modbury Sports and Community Club, 2 Hazel Grove, Ridgehaven. The AGM will immediately follow a brief general meeting that will commence at 7:30pm

Any agenda items or notices of motion should be in writing and be addressed to the Secretary, PO BOX 35, Holden Hill, South Australia, 5088.

These should be received not less than 14 days prior to the AGM.

All committee positions will be declared void and nominations will be sought to fill these positions.

Code of Ethics

- Keep to the laws and regulations on recreation vehicles. They vary from state to state.
- Others have a right to peace and solitude - avoid noisy driving or riding near settlements and general recreation areas.
- Keep to approved vehicle corridors and tracks. On beaches and unvegetated sand areas, drive only where permitted.
- Alpine areas, swamps and vegetated dunes are easily damaged. Avoid them.
- Respect our wildlife. Stop and look, but never disturb or chase animals. It can affect their survival.
- Keep the environment clean. Carry your own and maybe other peoples' rubbish home.
- Keep all fire restrictions. Extinguish your fire before leaving. Don't let your exhaust emit sparks.
- Keep to restrictions on use of public land. Respect national parks and other conservation areas.
- Get permission before driving on private land. Leave livestock alone and gates as found.
- Keep your vehicle mechanically sound and quiet with an efficient muffler.
- Take adequate water, food, fuel and spares on trips. In remote areas travel with another vehicle.
- Join an appropriate and responsible recreation club if you use your vehicle mainly for recreation.
- Help in bushfire emergencies and search and rescue, if you are properly equipped and able.

TRIP PRE-REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS:
PRE-REGISTRATION must occur before
the pre-registration Cut-off date.

All first time Visitors, Past members and un-financial members need to provide details to Membership Officer before pre-registration is accepted.

Applicant to enter:

1. Vehicle Registration number,
2. Main driver first name and surname,
3. All passenger's first names and surnames,
4. Main Driver to discuss relevant 4WD experience with trip leader and any potential medical issues for driver and all passengers.

Participants should always carry Personal medical and emergency contact details in vehicle glove box and discuss potential medical issues with trip leader.

Ngarkat CP Track Survey - 18th to 20th August 2017

Location	(South-Eastern) Ngarkat Conservation Park (CP)
Dates	Friday 18th to Sunday 20th August 2017
Trip Leader	Darryl McManus (
Trip Starting Point	<p>Ngarkat CP Doggers Hut campsite (South-Eastern Ngarkat CP). Doggers Hut campsite turnoff is accessible from the Bordertown-Pinaroo road (Ngarkat Highway B57) via the Mt. Shaugh Track turnoff at (approx.) 35°48'21.0"S 140°47'46.7"E (look for the sign), it is on the eastern side of the road (left hand side when heading south). This is (approx.) 60.5km south of the turn from the Mallee Highway (B12). Follow the Mt. Shaugh Track east for (approx.) 15km to the Border Track, then turn left and head north for (approx.) 4.2km to the Doggers Hut campsite entrance at (approx.) 35°46'11.5"S 140°57'46.4"E. The campsite is immediately adjacent on the western side of the Border Track.</p>  <p>Trip start time is 9:00 am on the Saturday of the trip. You can setup on the Friday afternoon or evening if you like.</p>

Trip Description	Conservation Park track survey in Mallee country, Volunteers will be traversing (collectively) public, fire access and management access tracks in the South-Eastern part of the Ngarkat CP with the aim to collect detailed GPS waypoints/tracks data.
Trip Route	Route will consist of driving assigned tracks in the South-Eastern Section of the Ngarkat CP. Vehicles will be (at least) paired for safety and data redundancy.
Trip Requirements	GPS Navigation & Logging equipment (ie. OziExplorer or HEMA). Full sand recovery gear, UHF radio, air compressor, sand flag. Also bring working gloves, hi-visibility vests, sturdy footwear, clothing suitable to provide sun, wind and rain protection.
Fuel Requirements	Fuel (Petrol & Diesel) available at Taillem Bend and Lameroo, ~600 km return to Adelaide, up to ~200 km sand driving may be required.
Trip Accommodation	There are NO facilities at the Doggers Hut campsite. You must be fully self-sufficient with water, waste, fuel & food.
Trip Costs	None - camping and entrance fees waived for volunteers.
Trip Conditions & Comments	Doggers Hut campsite is accessible to off-road camper trailers. No pets allowed in the Ngarkat CP. Campfires are allowed, please bring a bag or two of firewood. Trip may be postponed if the weather is too wet.
